Year 6 enjoyed a workshop on WW2 where they looked at the impact of the war on Hackney. The children learnt how it affected the life of an Austrian refugee who fled the Nazis and moved to Stamford Hill - the now 90-year-old still lives there today! 5S met an animal rebellion activist, James Ozden, for a zoom talk where they learned about different types of activism and the ways in which everyone can make a difference.

4/5D had a fantastic time watching a live pantomime performance based on the story of Cinderella. 4A have been learning about Varjak Paw (Mesopotamian blue cat) and his incredible adventure to help save his family whilst also planning experiments based on condensations and testing out theories. 3L have written some fantastic poems about fossils and used amazing adjectives and similes.

2M have been exploring 2D shapes in maths. They studied the artist, Wassily Kandinsky, and created oil pastel paintings using shape, in a similar style. Year 1 have been making Easter egg baskets and have enjoyed an Easter egg hunt around the playground! The children in Reception have been reading 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' and writing lists of all the different foods that the caterpillar ate. They, along with Nursery class, have also been watching their own caterpillars get bigger and bigger as they eat more food. Soon, they will make chrysalis's and transform into butterflies!

They then enjoyed eating their creations afterwards!








Excellence Assembly!
