I'd like to start by saying Eid Mubarak to everyone who has been celebrating with their families and friends this week!

It has been a fantastic week of learning at Harrington Hill. 5S have been learning about weather and climate. They measured the temperature outside throughout the day and created a line graph to represent it. They then compared rainfall in London to Istanbul and drew a comparison bar chart. Finally, they made windsocks and completed a fair test to represent wind direction depending on the location of the windsock.

Year 2 have enjoyed reading *The Bear and the Piano*. They discussed their opinions of the book using conjunctions and the recorded a video book review!

This week, children in Nursery and Reception have acted out scenes in role as the different characters from *Little Red Riding Hood*. They even learnt a song that links with the story. Watch out for the Big Bad Wolves in EYFS!

Year 4 have been working hard in maths this week. The children have been practising short division, using concrete resources to group.

In English, 3L have been learning how to write a non-chronological report linked to their DT topic *Global Cuisine*. In DT, they designed a healthy meal which they are going to learn how to prepare and make next week!

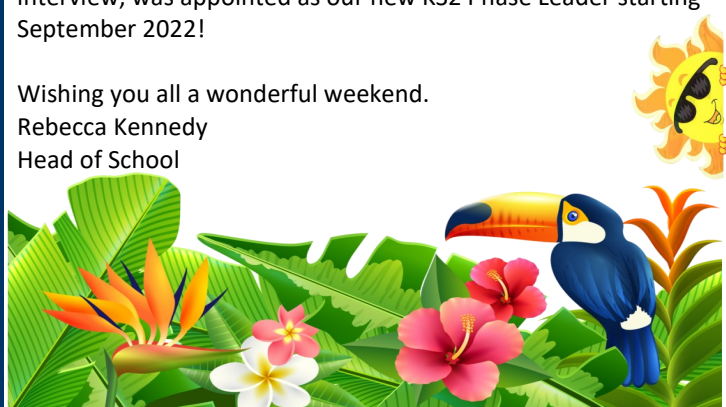

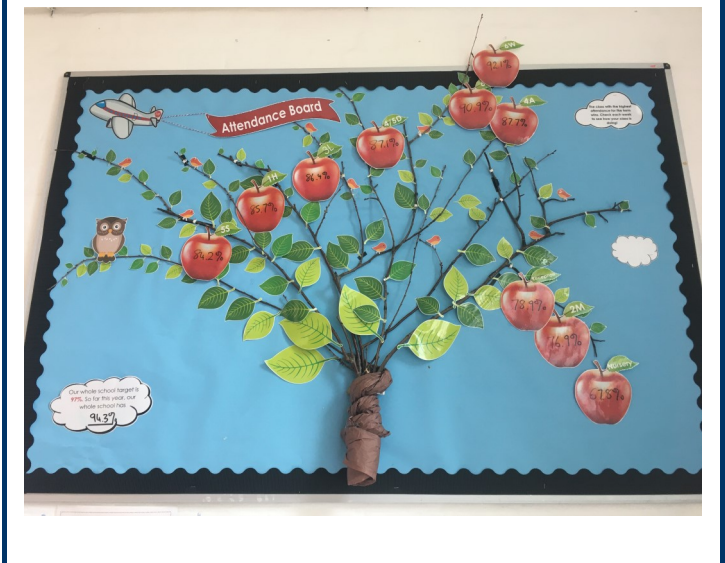

Overall, since starting in September, the whole school attendance is 94.3% (see display board below).

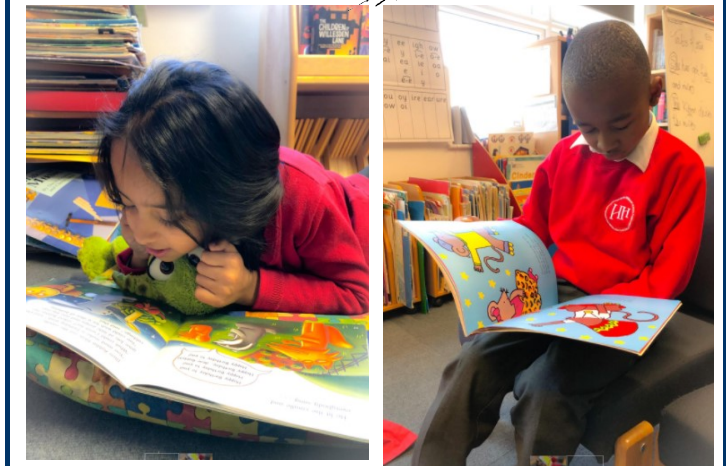
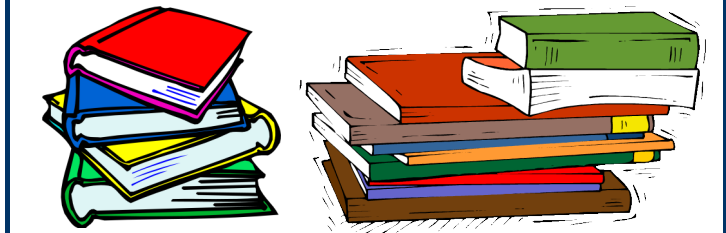


A huge well done to all the children who have had 100% attendance this week!
