

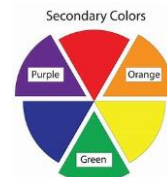
**Key Vocabulary**

Culture	The ideas, customs, and social behaviour of a particular people or society.
Traditions	Tradition is a belief or behaviour (folk custom) passed down within a group or society with symbolic meaning.
Mono printing	Mono printing is a form of printmaking that has lines or images that can only be made once.
Primary colours	These are colours that cannot be created through the mixing of other colours.
Secondary colours	A secondary colour is a colour made by mixing of two primary colours.
Polystyrene	A type of material called synthetic resin.
Lino	A material consisting of a canvas backing thickly coated with a preparation of linseed oil and powdered cork.
Etching	Etching is traditionally the process of using strong acid to cut into the metal surface to create a design.
Texture	A structure of interwoven fibres or other materials.
Pattern	A particular way in which something is done or organized.
Overlay	Something laid over something else.
Block printing	The process of carving patterns, shapes and designs into a 'block'.

Print using 4 colours to create overlay.

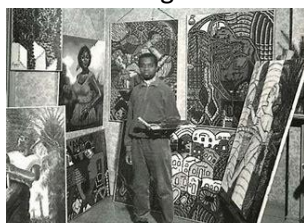
Use different objects to create prints (rollers, paintbrush, objects, sponge, IT).
