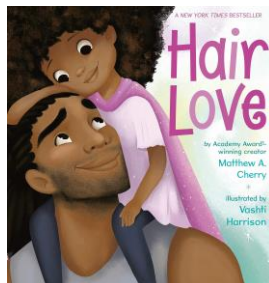

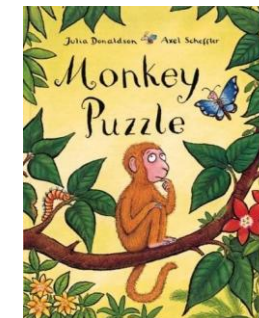

<p><b>We will be learning how to:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Count objects, actions and sounds</li> <li>- Recognise numerals from 1-5 then 1-10</li> </ul> <p><b>You can Help Me At Home By:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Build counting into everyday routines at home such as counting out plates and cups at dinner time. Go on a number hunt around your home.</li> </ul>	<p><b>We will be learning how to:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Build positive relationships</li> <li>- Express our feelings and consider others feelings</li> <li>- Express likes and dislikes, recognising there are differences and we are all unique</li> </ul> <p><b>You can Help Me At Home By:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Encourage children to express their feelings if they feel hurt or upset using descriptive vocabulary</li> <li>- Encouraging sharing and turn taking</li> </ul>	<p><b>We will be learning how to:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Be an active listener</li> <li>- Listen carefully to stories, rhymes and poems</li> <li>- Learn new vocabulary</li> <li>- Blend sounds together</li> </ul> <p><b>You can Help Me At Home By:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Reviewing new vocabulary together at home and trying to use it everyday</li> <li>- Talking to me in a robot voice to help me learn how to blend words together e.g. p-i-ck u-p the h-a-t</li> </ul>

<p><b>We will be learning how to:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Sing in a group or on their own</li> <li>- Develop storylines in their pretend play</li> </ul> <p><b>You can Help Me At Home By:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Play with me at how modelling how to create a story line and build on what each other is saying</li> <li>- Practice singing songs – you could learn a song together as a family?</li> </ul>	<p><b>We will be learning how to:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Move our bodies in different ways</li> <li>- Use a knife and fork with improved accuracy</li> </ul> <p><b>You can Help Me At Home By:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Play with playdough to help strengthen finger muscles – roll, squish, squeeze, pinch</li> <li>- Helping me use a knife and fork at mealtimes</li> </ul>	<p><b>We will be learning how to:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Talk about our families</li> <li>- Name and describe people who are familiar to us in the community e.g. police officers, doctors, teachers.</li> </ul> <p><b>You can Help Me At Home By:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Learning about how families are different</li> <li>- Exploring the local community and help me learn about the adults who work in our community</li> </ul>
