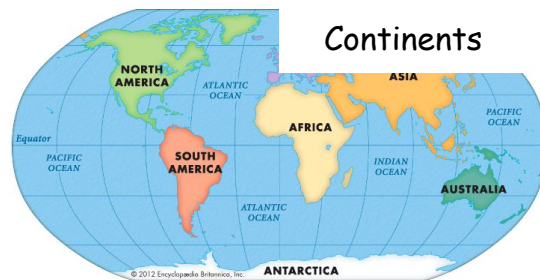
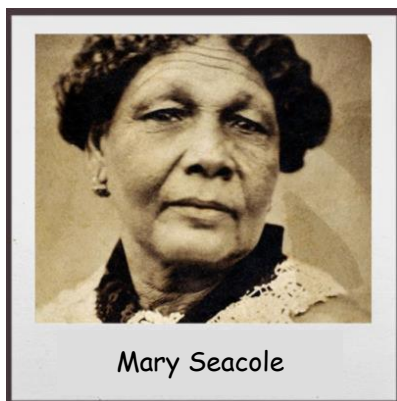
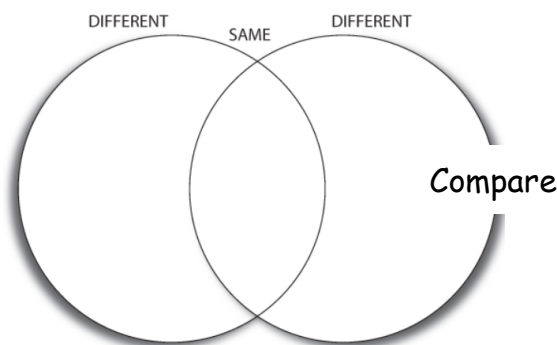

Continents	A <b>continent</b> is a large solid area of land. Earth has seven continents.
Map	A <b>map</b> is a drawing of all or part of Earth's surface.
Equator	An <b>equator</b> divides the planet into a <i>Northern</i> and a <i>Southern Hemisphere</i> .
Northern and a Southern Hemisphere.	Places north of the <i>equator</i> are part of the <b>Northern Hemisphere</b> . Places south of the <i>equator</i> are in the <b>Southern Hemisphere</b> .
