Roman Numerals	Roman numerals are a numeral system that originated in ancient Rome.
Legion	A group of cavalries in the ancient Roman army.
Slaves	Someone who is forbidden to quit their service for another person, while treated as property.
Gladiator	A man trained to fight with weapons against other men.
Tactics	An action or strategy carefully planned.
Conquer	Overcome and take control.
Britons	The indigenous Celtic people who inhabited Great Britain.
Icenii	The Icenii were a Brittonic tribe.
Tribe	An organization consisting of several families, clans, or other groups who share a common culture.
Celts	The Celts are a collection of Indo-European peoples in parts of Europe.
Equator	The equator divides the planet into the Northern Hemisphere and Southern Hemisphere.
Weather patterns	Weather patterns is the day-to-day conditions of the atmosphere in a particular place.
Globe	A globe is a spherical model of Earth.
Continents	A continent is one of several large landmasses.
Oceans	An ocean is a body of water.
Maps	A map is a symbolic depiction of a place or area.
