Key Vocabulary

Vikings	The Vikings were people who sailed from Scandinavia and attacked villages in most parts of north-western Europe from the 8th to the 11th centuries.
Anglo Saxons	Anglo-Saxon, term used historically to describe any member of the Germanic peoples who, from the 5th century ce to the time of the Norman Conquest (1066), inhabited and ruled territories that are today part of England and Wales
Location	A particular place or position
Compass	An instrument containing a magnetized pointer which shows the direction of magnetic north and bearings from it.
Cultures	The ideas, customs, and social behaviour of a particular people or society
Equator	A line through the centre of the Earth dividing the Southern and Northern hemispheres
Hurricanes	A storm with a violent wind, in particular a tropical cyclone in the Caribbean.
Eruption	A volcanic eruption occurs when magma is released from a volcano
Cause	make (something, especially something bad) happen
Effect	A change which is a result or consequence of an action or other cause
Tsunami	A long, high sea wave caused by an earthquake or other disturbance
Longitude	Longitude is the measurement east or west of the prime meridian
Latitude	Latitude is the measurement of distance north or south of the Equator
Map	A diagrammatic representation of an area of land or sea showing physical features, cities, roads, etc.

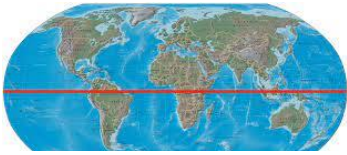
