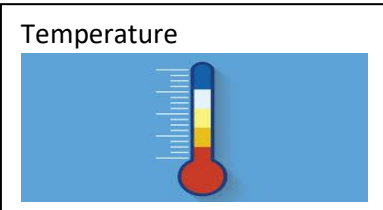
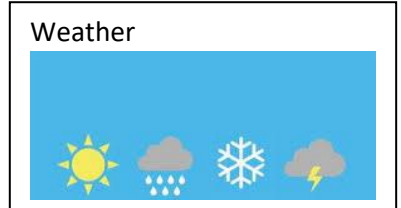
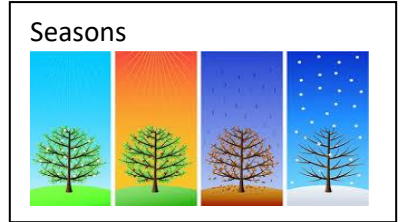


Key Vocabulary	
Seasons	Each of the four divisions of the year (Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter)
Summer	The warmest season of the year from June to August.
Spring	The season in which plants begins to grow from March to May.
Autumn	The season where trees begin to lose their leaves from September to November.
Winter	The coldest season of the year where temperatures are low. Snow and rain are frequent from December to February.
Change	An act or process through which something becomes different.
Weather	A state of the atmosphere at a particular place and time.
Temperature	A physical quantity that expresses hot and cold.
Shadow	A dark area or shape produced by a body coming between rays of light.
Deciduous	A tree or shrub shedding its leaves annually.
Evergreen	A plant that retains green leaves throughout the year.
