Dear Families,

We have had a fantastic couple of weeks of learning at Harrington Hill with the children especially enjoying lots of hands on activities linked to their science topics.

This week 2M, have been planting cress seeds. They have been learning to record the growth of the plants and will continue to do this weekly and make comparisons.

Year 4 are linking literacy and science together by writing a persuasive text all about the importance of reducing plastic pollution in the oceans to save our marine life. In coming weeks, they will also be helping the environment by litter picking by the marshes as they've learnt that plastic gets swept away from canals into rivers and then eventually to our seas.

This week 3T have been learning to count, add and subtract money in maths while in literacy they have learnt about the suffix -'ly' and have been coming up with adverbs that have this suffix. They have also been learning how to write a setting description, culminating in a setting description of Willy Wonka's chocolate room. In science, 3T are looking forward to carrying out investigations as they start learning about how water travels through plants.

Year 1 have also enjoyed being scientists and using magnifying glasses outside to investigate the changes in our environment. In literacy this week, the children have enjoyed creating descriptive characters for their short narratives.

Reception are enjoying their new focus story 'Stone Girl Bone Girl', learning all about the life and achievements of Mary Anning, a pioneering palaeontologist whose ground breaking discoveries were not properly credited in her time. Children have been writing simple sentences in 'fact files' as well as creating fossil arts and crafts.

In 5L, the children have been learning about money and decimals—they have been adding money using the column addition method and applying their problem solving skills. In science, they have been planting seeds and observing the germination process. They have been using their observation, questioning and recording skills during this process.

Year 6 have been working hard to create persuasive letters, addressed to John Hopkins Hospital, persuading them to take action to honour Henrietta Lacks (an African-American whose cancer cells were used for research purposes).

In a few weeks time we are going to be taking part in Safer Internet day. We will be sending a letter next week with some helpful links and resources for supporting your child to stay safe online. Lots going on—I can't believe how quickly this half term is going!

Covid Update

We continue to ask that parents do not enter the school building unless a meeting has been pre-arranged.

Unless exempt, please wear a face mask when on the school grounds.

No children should attend school if they have Covid symptoms, no matter how mild or common cold-like.

Guidance states that children between 5 and 18mths do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a close contact, tests positive for Covid-19. Instead they need to take a Lateral Flow Test every day for 7 days and continue to come to school as long as they have no symptoms and the test results are negative. If a child tests positive on a Lateral Flow Test, they are required to isolate for 5 full days and can return to school once they have had two negative tests.

Getting to school on time




