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Introduction

Harrington Hill Primary School is a multicultural school and we are very proud of the cultural harmony that exists. There is an assembly each day, which is non-denominational and is a very important part in the life of the school.

Assemblies contribute to the individual's personal and spiritual development as well as the social and moral values, which we consider to be part of the ethos of the school. The Senior Leadership Team and teachers, as well as guest speakers and visitors from the local community, lead the assemblies. We have a weekly achievement assembly which celebrates children's efforts, attendance and excellent behaviour.

From September 2021, we will incorporate a blended model for delivering assemblies - assemblies will either take place in person or virtually, using Microsoft Teams.

Aims

1. To allow all pupils to reflect on their own values and beliefs as well as those of others
2. To celebrate our diverse community through a shared vision based on common values
3. To reinforce spiritual and moral elements of the curriculum to improve learning
4. To celebrate and share academic and social achievements

It is the statutory duty of the school to provide a daily assembly for registered pupils. Parents have the right to withdraw their child from assembly and should inform the Head of School in writing if they wish to do so.

Singing Assembly Guidance

-Singing Assembly is led by the music teacher with the support of a member of SLT.

-Songs are primarily selected to fit in with current assembly themes. Twice a term, the song selection is linked to the jigsaw whole school theme.

Excellence Assembly Guidance

-Two certificates are awarded per class: 1) Learning Behaviour 2) An excellent piece of work

-Playground award certificates are prepared by the Learning Mentor and read out by the member of staff leading the assembly

In addition, when the assembly is held in person:

-Each week, all the pupils with 100% attendance and no lates are entered into a random name generator. One child from each phase is selected during the assembly and receives a prize.

- The Harrington Hill School song is sung at the end.
