Dear Families,

This week many of our classes have been working hard to complete assessments, therefore it was great to be able to celebrate Red Nose Day together on Friday and enjoy some lighthearted relief at the end of the week! We managed to raise **£318.98!** To mark the event, it was fantastic to finally have an in-person assembly again on Friday afternoon—the children particularly savoured seeing a few unlucky members of staff getting splatted in the face with a whipped cream pie! Thank you to everyone for their kind donations.

As always, there has been lots of exciting learning taking place across the school. Year 6 are currently studying Inheritance and evolution in Science and used the information they learned about evolution to create their own evolved endemic species and write a newspaper report in literacy based on its discovery.

3T have been researching information about Joan Proctor, a British zoologist. They have been learning the features of a biography in order to write their own biography about her. In Science, they have been learning about the 7 nutrients and what makes a healthy diet.

As part of their learning focus on the local area, Reception visited Clapton Library earlier this week. They had a special story telling session with the librarian and were each allowed to choose a book to borrow!

This week in 2M, the children have been researching different animals and enjoyed describing them using expanded noun phrases in their writing.

5L have been writing non-chronological reports linked to 'Climate Crisis' and have been learning to use subordinating conjunctions. In R.E, they discussed 'Morals and Values' and created colourful posters to express their values and beliefs.

Year 4 have been working with money this week. They have been learning how to compare, order and problem solve with money. The children enjoyed setting up their own shops and taking on the roles of cashiers, shopkeepers, traders, and bankers.

10 have also had a fun-filled week - they particularly relished taking part in the red nose spoon race on Monday and have also enjoyed observing and comparing weather conditions in Science. In maths, the children have a been learning about place value in 2 digit numbers.

With the recent sunshine and longer days, it finally feels like Spring is here! I hope you all have a restful weekend and are able to get outside and enjoy the brighter weather.
