Dear Families,

There has been lots happening at Harrington Hill since our return to school after the Easter holidays. This term we are having our whole school focus on Art and Design Technology so it has been fantastic to see children getting creative and enjoying their new topics through a range of art activities.

Year 6 have started their Art topic 'Self-Portraits' and are enjoying expressing different emotions through facial expressions. They have also been working hard in preparation for their upcoming SATS week, impressing their teachers with fantastic focus and resilience!

This week Year 1 have been learning about Vincent Van Gogh. They have enjoyed exploring his paintings and discussing the mood that they create—the children had fun recreating some of his masterpieces!

5L have been reading the book 'Shackleton's journey' and have been using their persuasive writing knowledge to write letters to the captain, persuading him to allow them to become members of the ship's crew. As part of our school's art focus this term, they have also been learning different painting techniques such as using tone, tint and shading.

This week, 2M have been writing diary entries linked to their class text 'Billy and the Beast'. They have also started their art topic 'A Moment in Time' which is focusing on still life drawing.

Reception have been learning about the customs and traditions of Ramadan and Eid this week. They made crafts to decorate their homes including the new moon which symbolises the end of Ramadan.

4B have been looking at famous architecture from around the world and discussing their designs. They have also been researching Zaha Hadid, a renowned Iraqi Architect whose most prominent work was the London Aquatic centre built for the 2012 Olympics.

Over the last couple of weeks, 3T have been learning about cuisines from South Asia and are compiling a non-chronological report on them in Literacy. They have also been learning about their feature artist Winston Branch and have started to learn about the founding of Buddhism in R.E.

Many of you will have noticed our Forest School is almost finished. We are looking forward to opening it in the not too distant future once final checks and tweaks have been made. Very exciting! As we finish another busy week, we wish you all a restful and happy bank holiday weekend - let's hope we get some sunshine!


