Harrington Hill pupils have enjoyed getting stuck into Black History Month where they have participated in a range of activities linked to key significant figures from the past. Our 'Shine a Light' assemblies have celebrated important people, from Rosa Parks to Joe Clough. Thank you also to our kitchen team who cooked a delicious international feast including the very popular jollof rice and plantain!

Year 3 have started their new Literacy text 'Ug'. In maths they have been adding and subtracting 1s and 10s using exchanging. For Black History Month, the childre have learned about Joe Clough, London's first black bus driver (and likely the U.K's first black ambulance driver). They will be visiting the London Transport Museum to learn more about London Transport's Caribbean workforce at the end of half term.

Year 2 have been comparing this week. They have been able to talk about the differences and similarities between Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale. They have also begun reading the book "Look Up" and have drawn some of their own star constellations.

Year 6 are learning about Electricity and have enjoyed making and drawing circuits using scientific symbols this week. Ask a member of Year 6 about circuit components or any top tips on creating your own!







Year One have had an amazing week learning about the four compass points and using directional vocabulary to locate objects on a map. They have also written short stories about their book 'The Night Pirates.'







Year 5 have been reading a fantastic book called 'The Goldfish Boy' by Lisa Thompson about a young boy who lives with Obsessive Compulsive Disorder. This book has encouraged them to explore and celebrate their differences and, in English, children have enjoyed writing a letter of advice and support to Matthew (the main character in the story).

The children enjoyed a delicious lunch as part of Black History Month. Thank you to the kitchen team for cooking such a tasty feast!














