

What's been going on this week?



Welcome to Harrington Hill for all the families new to our community. The children have all settled into school life fantastically this week and we are very proud of the excellence we have seen around the school. A great start to the new school year!

The children in Nursery have had a brilliant first few days. They are settling into class routines and making friends. Reception have also had a fantastic week at school. They are focused on the routines and expectations of the classroom, which children are doing a great job of following. New children

are making friends and feeling settled. The children went to Forest School for the first time this year and enjoyed the sunshine!

Year 1 have had a fabulous week. They have been exploring different number bonds and have used concrete resources such as cubes and place value coins to support. In English, the children also showed great focus; they wrote sentences to describe the character in their book 'Look Up' and even included adjectives. Well done also to Miss Lee's phonics group as they showed amazing enthusiasm this week!

Year 2 have had a great week settling in and getting to grips with their new learning. Ms Tooze has been so impressed with their grouping of tens and partitioning of 2-digit numbers in maths. During English the children have read their focus text Ravi's Roar and written a book review using the conjunction 'because'. Linked to their focus text, they had a PSHE lesson around what they could do when they feel angry to help calm down. Finally, in topic lessons, the children have learnt what it means to be a significant person in history and discussed significant people in their lives.

Year 3 have had a great start to the year. From an immersive Stone Age day to creating wonderful self-portraits during their 'getting to know you' sessions. This week the children started their book work; they have worked very hard on their presentation using cursive handwriting and focusing on punctuation. They also went to Forest school, role playing what it would be like to live in the Stone Age, hunting and gathering, building shelters and creating imaginary fires. During maths, Year 3 have used place value to solve logical problems and make posters! Well done everyone!

Year 4 have been reading the book 'George's marvellous medicine' by Roald Dahl and writing captivating character descriptions about the main characters using key vocabulary and expanded noun phrases. The children will be moving on to writing their own chapter of the book in the coming week.

Year 5 have settled excellently into the new school year and have been enjoying their new topic Ancient Benin. They have been asking questions about images of Benin artefacts and making connections. They have also been writing a setting description of an African desert using rich vocabulary to generate expanded noun phrases and adverbials.

Year 6's topic this half-term is Ancient Greece and during their English lessons, they have been learning about Theseus and the Minotaur. Year 6 have begun to retell this narrative with a focus on figurative language. See below for some examples of their fantastic writing!

They have settled into the Harrington Hill family wonderfully and we look forward to working with them this year!




1 - Tara Kajee has joined us as a teaching assistant working across years 2 and 6.


